## **St Benedict's Primary Mini Vinnies Program**

Mini Vinnies is a social justice program of the St Vincent de Paul Society which exists in many primary schools. Mini Vinnies empowers primary school students to become advocates within their school and local community by putting their values into action. They meet regularly to learn about social justice issues, develop leadership skills and engage with the wider St Vincent de Paul Society.

The Mini Vinnies model of "See, Think, Do" is a great way to get young people thinking and talking about their spirituality and to connect their faith with issues affecting their community through volunteering, advocacy and fundraising. Not only do the students in Mini Vinnies benefit from the experience but also the school and wider community.

St Benedict's Primary will be opening this program to all year levels K-6. Due to some initiatives requiring a more mature understanding of social justice some initiative opportunities will only be available to the older grades.

Students in K-6 will have the opportunity to be involved in:

- Organising toiletry packs for the St Vincent de Paul Night Patrol Van
- Organising Winter Woolies Day to raise awareness of homelessness and collect donations for the Night Patrol and Street to Home Program
- A weekly lunchtime meeting, prayer as well as discussion about social justice issues, reflection on human dignity and fundraising planning
- Organising the Christmas Hamper appeal

Students in Years 4-6 will also have the opportunity to be involved in:

- The school Sleep Out

Students in Years 5-6 will have the opportunity to be involved in:

- Homeless Connect Day <http://northside.asn.au/community-services/homeless-connect/>

- Mini Vinnies Student Conference (networking day across schools)
- Liaising with our Vinnies Parish Conference

To be a Mini Vinnie, we require commitment from students to attend weekly meetings, perform weekly duties during school, and to prepare and participate in initiatives (when appropriate).
